

KEVIN FENTON, is associate professor of choral conducting and ensembles at Florida State University. From 2003 to 2007, he served as the National R&S Chair for College and University Choirs and he served as the Program Chair for the 2002 Southern Division Convention in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Kevin began his teaching career in Kansas as the Vocal Music Teacher at Topeka High School (1984-1991) and he has also served as Director of Choral Activities at James Madison University and Virginia Tech. On several occasions, he has conducted ensembles in performances for state and regional conventions of the American Choral Directors Association and the Music Educator's National Conference including the University Singers performances for the Southern Division Convention in 2002 and 2006 and the National Convention in 2007. Kevin has prepared choirs for Krzysztof Penderecki (2004), Bobby McFerrin (2004) and Robert Shaw (1998). As a result of his positive approach to rehearsals, Dr. Fenton has served as a clinician for numerous workshops, honor choirs and clinics in twenty-five states throughout the country. In the spring of 2007, he will guest conduct all-state honor choirs in West Virginia, South Carolina, and Oklahoma, and he will conduct the 2007 Beijing International Choral Festival. Kevin has authored several articles appearing in the *Choral Journal*, the *Music Educators Journal*, and the *Bulletin for Historical Research in Music Education*, and is a recipient of the Gamma Mu Chapter of Delta Omicron Music Professor of the Year Award.

Professor Fenton holds the Ph.D. from Florida State University, the M.M. from the Conservatory of Music at the University of Missouri in Kansas City and the B.M.E. from Friends University in Wichita, Kansas.
